Friday, February 24, 2017

Scholarship information, scholarship applications and timelines will be distributed at the STLSBP Annual Workshop on Friday, February 24, 2017, emailed to members on Wednesday, March 1, 2017 and available on the partnership web site stlsbp.org.

Friday, April 14, 2017

All scholarship applications, essays, and required documents must be received and postmarked by not later than 4:00pm Friday, April 14, 2017.

April 15 – April 27, 2017

STLSBP Scholarship Committee will review all scholarship applications, essays, and required documents and select two scholarship winners.

April 28, 2017

Scholarship winners and their schools will be notified.

May 1, 2017

All STLSBP members will be notified by email as to the school districts of the winning students.

May 10, 2017

Scholarship winners will receive Scholarship Award at the STLSBP End of the Year Luncheon.

Scholarship Procedures 2016-2017

The following actions are to be considered in the event that student scholarship recipients are unable to use the scholarship monies awarded by STLSBP Scholarship Committee. **STLSBP is not liable and is held harmless for scholarship monies not used for Fall 2017 semester.**

- Scholarship awards are to be used for school costs, such as tuition and fees including books, at a post-secondary institution.
- Scholarship awards must be used at a post-secondary institution for the Fall semester as stated in the existing guidelines.
- Scholarship awards are not issued to the student but to the appropriate department of the post-secondary institution.
- Unused scholarship monies must be returned to the St. Louis School-Business Scholarship.
- Unused scholarship monies will not be held until a later semester.
- If a student is unable to attend a post-secondary institution, for any reason, then the scholarship award must be returned to the St. Louis School-Business Partnership as soon as possible. This policy must be stated and sent to the post-secondary institution along with the award payment.
- Partnership options in processing returned scholarship awards:
 1. If the scholarship award is returned to the STLSBP Treasurer in advance of the current Fall semester then the Scholarship Committee could award the scholarship to a new qualified and deserving applicant. The committee would select from the current data base of applicants if there was sufficient time and returned monies to do so before the Fall semester begins. The Scholarship committee could select an alternate deserving applicant, if possible from the current applicant pool, in case a scholarship recipient does not use the scholarship award.
 2. If the money is returned after the beginning of the Fall semester the Scholarship Committee could award one extra scholarship during the next scholarship applicant cycle the following Spring semester if monies are projected to be available.

2016-2017 Scholarship Requirements

The St. Louis School-Business Partnership (STLSBP) has established two \$1000 scholarships to be awarded to graduating seniors from high schools who are current paid members of the Partnership. The scholarship funds are sent and issued to the school of the recipients' choice. (school may be a four year university/college, two-year college, business or technical school). **(Monies should be used for school costs, tuition, and fees including books for only the Fall 2017 semester. STLSBP is not liable and is held harmless for scholarship monies not used for the Fall 2017 semester.)**

Interested seniors must complete the scholarship application and return it along with the additional required information and documents electronically to kdillard@stlcc.edu by **Friday, April 14, 2017**. The STLSBP Scholarship Committee will review all applications, transcripts, essays, references and determine scholarship recipients. Scholarship recipients will be announced on or before April 28, 2017. Scholarship certificates will be presented to students at the May 10, 2017 End of the Year Partnership luncheon at South Technical High School. Students must attend the May luncheon to receive the scholarship.

Eligibility Requirements

- Must be a student at a STLSBP paid member school.
- Must graduate from a paid member school year by **June 2017**.
- Have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or better.
- Plan to enroll in a university or college, two-year college, business or technical school **Fall 2017. (Unclaimed scholarship monies will not be held and must be returned to STLSBP)**

Additional Scholarship Application Requirements

- Provide two (2) letters of reference from adults (not related to the applicant) including one letter from a high school professional staff member.
- Include a copy of your school transcript with the application.
- Complete a one (1) to two (2) page typed essay (double spaced, 12-point font) on the following topic.

The mission of the St. Louis School-Business Partnership is to foster a dynamic collaboration between school, community and businesses.

In your Essay please address the following topic:

Topic: How can schools, communities and businesses work together to provide learning experiences for high school students. Give two two specific examples of collaborations that could be developed by your school.
